A Message from Bishop David



The Gospel story fulfils the words of the ancient prophets, written many years before the events they were talking about. St Luke recognises the words of the prophet Isaiah in the life and ministry of St John the Baptist. I love the way this Gospel moment begins. The evangelist speaks of the different rulers and leaders of his time. We too live in a particular time with particular world leaders and national leaders. We should pray for our leaders, especially after the COP 26 gathering in Glasgow and the focus on global warming. We should pray they have the courage to change things so that our world does not overheat!

For sure, when Pope Francis and others speak in this warning way, they might seem like voices crying in the wilderness. John the Baptist had the courage to speak God's word, and we must do the same.

Let's pray this week that we might listen carefully to the Gospel and want to be involved in proclaiming this life-giving word to those around us, especially by the way we live our lives and seek God's kingdom above everything else.

Preparing for to celebrate the birth of Jesus over 2000 years ago in Bethlehem


Preparing for Jesus to come and be born in our hearts this Christmas

Preparing for Jesus to come again in glory


John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus



A Reading from the Gospel of St Luke Glory to you O Lord








In the gospel John the Baptist reminds us to prepare for Jesus coming

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness.

John went through the whole area proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth.

Everyone shall see the salvation of God.
