
Celebrating Palm Sunday

A Message from Bishop David

My dear young friends,



When I was your age, a long time ago now, I always found Palm Sunday an exciting liturgy. We began outside the church and after a reading and prayers, processed into the church singing and waving our palm branches. It wasn't quite like the first Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. But it was the next best thing! I do find myself wondering, what was it like for the first group of people who welcomed Jesus into the holy city? Maybe they had many expectations. Here was the King coming to his throne as the Messiah. Rather like the first days of a new government, maybe they expected real change and things could only get better. Maybe too, some of these people were apprehensive and thinking that the atmosphere wasn't entirely carnival. The leaders of Israel were watching on and it was clear that they were not happy. As we know, just a few days later, they used their power to do what they could to finish the teaching ministry of Jesus.

So what about us today? We too are living in challenging times. Maybe we want to sing and dance, praising God as we put our trust in him. Then again, perhaps it is not like that for us. I think there is an important lesson we can receive in our celebration of Palm Sunday. And that lesson is about praise and worship. When we look at different situations in our lives, we might think about the excitement of those occasions and the sense of celebration. For example, at a birthday party! Do we ever think we can praise God for the wonderful ways he has given us life, new life in baptism, and the promise of life in heaven with him for ever? On Palm Sunday, let us join the crowd in giving thanks and praise to Jesus. And if you go to church, even though there will be no possessions this year because of the virus restrictions, you can still get a palm leaf to wave and help you celebrate.




Set aside some time in your day to gather together for prayer Make sure you are all sitting comfortably Light a candle


Palm Sunday



Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week when we think about Jesus death and resurrection.







Jesus and his friends went to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover, a special Jewish festival.



Just before they arrived in Jerusalem Jesus told two of his disciples to: 'Go into the village and you will find a donkey and its colt. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone asks you what you are doing tell them they are for me and I will send them back as soon as I can'






The disciples brought the donkey back to Jesus. They threw their cloaks on its back and Jesus sat on it. Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Jesus did not ride into Jerusalem on a horse like a King going into battle. Instead Jesus rode on a donkey the animal of poor people. Jesus showed that he is a friend of the poor and that he came in peace.




A huge crowd gathered to meet Jesus. Many people spread their cloaks on the ground. Others laid down palm branches which they had cut down from the trees.

Some of the people in the crowd were poor and sick. In Jesus they saw new hope for their lives. They cried out 'HOSANNA!' which means 'PLEASE SAVE US'

They cheered and shouted gladly: 'HOSANNA TO THE SON OF DAVID!'




Jesus is of the family of David and Jerusalem is David's city. People remembered a happy time when David was King. They know Jesus will bring them happiness.
